Sadly, the first ringing was to commemorate the tragic deaths of the school shootings in Newtown, CT. We were glad that the Rochester Democrat and Chronicle and WHAM TV covered this historic event.

A couple of months ago, I became the longest serving pastor in the almost 200 years of our church's history. I am approaching my 15th anniversary as the pastor of WHBC. It has been and continues to be a joy.

This past September I moved out of the parsonage and into a townhome that I purchased in Scottsville. This is my first experience as a homeowner. I am amazed to find that the answer to the old biblical question, "Can a leopard change its spots?" is "Yes." My housekeeping is greatly improved. Thanks to the church for making this move possible.

In addition to serving as pastor, I have immensely enjoyed continuing to serve as choir director. I especially want to thank our choir members and our organist, Beverly Bixby, for their faithfulness and dedication.

In addition to ministry within our church, I am privileged to be engaged in other ministries in the community. It is fun to serve as chaplain to the West Henrietta Fire Department and Henrietta Fire District. I also am presently serving on the Board of the American Baptist Churches of the Rochester Genesee Region.

I enjoyed organizing and serving during the recent Pastors-as-Waiters Habitat fund raiser at Peppermint Restaurant.

Thanks to all for your willingness to serve in so many capacities---as officers and board members, participation in the prayer chain, and through individual acts of kindness.

MODERATOR'S REPORT 2012

Remember eagerly looking forward to the coming year of 2000? The millennium would change, we all wondered if our computers (and virtually everything else) would "crash", we could scarcely believe we had made it to this far off point in time. At least I did! And when, as a teen, I realized I'd be 68 years old in that far off year, I stopped worrying about it, since I knew there was no way I'd EVER be that old! And now we've polished off 2012 and are starting on 2013. Who knew???!!!

The past year has had its good and sad times, as always. We welcomed Jasmine Morse and Darnell Ashford into our fellowship when they were baptized in June. (And then they both showed off their acting abilities in the December Christmas pageant, the first time we'd been able to enjoy such a pageant in a long time. Many thanks to playwrite Bonny Healy and the Board of Christian Ed. as well as to Papa Joseph who was kept busy giving Baby Jesus a bottle throughout, and a decidedly comical, wisecracking little lamb!) We also had the joy of welcoming Marshall Smith, his daughter Valerie Bandemer, and Anne Greco into the church by letter of transfer in December of last year. What a joy to have them all with us!

Sadly, we lost two much loved members, this past year: Marge Spencer and Brunette Page. Each lady was so special in her own way, and leaves a multitude of lovely memories with us all. We continue to pray for their families.

As always, our boards worked diligently during the year to keep things moving smoothly, and we owe each of them a great deal of thanks and gratitude. Our Trustees work tirelessly every year, and this year accomplished even more than usual. It would seem that when one insists on living in a building created in 1838, there are ALWAYS things that must be either improved or fixed! So, in addition to taking care of leaking roofs, repairing our ramp walkway, having front step carpeting redone, repairing lights in the balcony and reworking the "Rube Goldberg-like maze of pipes that evolved over the last century" (Steve Wenthe's words for John Miller's work) in the basement, providing beautiful lawn and garden flowers (Dave and Ginny Chase), perhaps the most exciting project was the "detilting" of our church belfry, and the rehanging of our bell (which now sings a lovely, mellow, baritone song, which the vast majority of the congregation had never before heard.) Many, many thanks!

Our Board of Deacons does a splendid job, always, ministering to the spiritual needs of the congregation, those able to participate in church every Sunday and those who cannot be with us in person. In addition to providing Holy Communion to the church family each month, they visit the shut-ins, providing them with Communion and little gifts throughout the year. The Deacons host a Retreat every fall, this year at WHBC, featuring Paul Vick, known to several in the congregation. Paul gave a very moving presentation about his parents, who ministered to people in China for several years, and were tragically killed in a small plane crash on a trip back to that country when Paul was just a baby, he being the one and only survivor. He has led a very interesting, God-directed life, and it was a pleasure hearing him.

For the first time in many years, our Board of Christian Education could actually provide Christian education...... for children! As I said last year, God bless Debbie and Lee Covill! Vacation Bible School was again a big success, held in combination with St. Mark's Lutheran Church, with approximately 45 children attending. ACE class primarily used DVDs

this year: one entitled "God In America," giving interesting views regarding how people settling and living in the USA over many generations have thought about and responded to the idea of God, and their/our responses to Him in re-politics, our moral viewpoints, family life, et cet. Many involved discussions among the attendees resulted. The second one gave historic and archaeological views on the possible/probable routes of the Scriptural Exodus, and the trials involved for the Children of Israel. This DVD was produced by the History Channel, and was followed by class discussions. The Board, as always, managed the Hanging of the Greens in the sanctuary and the Decoration of the Christmas Tree (another "perfect" one from Don Hirschman), as well as doing the Advent Children's Moments.

Our Mission Committee, under auspices of the Board of Deacons, did its usual excellent job, with a brand new method of giving, this year. Named "Noisy Sunday", it involves dropping nothing but change into the metal patens passed around, thus the name. This occurs every third Sunday of the month. Everyone seems to enjoy it, it adds up to a surprisingly tidy amount, and is donated to a different worthy organization each month. As is always the case, donations to the major offerings during the church year have been very good.

We participated again in the Adopt-a-Family project, at Christmas, this time providing for a single mother and her son. We hope we contributed to their happiness at this very special time of year. We have been told many times, by people coming to our church for the first time, that they can feel our love. That's a wonderful thing to hear, and I know it's true, but I believe, even more important, is the fact that we are a praying church. We are commanded by the Lord to "love each other" and "pray for each other." We can surely do more (and should) along both those lines, but I believe we're at least on the right track. Many thanks to our pastor, to our Boards, and to all of you who strive to follow the Lord's wishes. God bless you!

- Trimmed bushes. Thanks to Kathy Juby!
- •Repaired door locks. Thanks John!

Church Building work accomplished:

- •John Miller did a great deal of work in the boiler room, eliminating unnecessary piping and providing a simpler way to fill the baptistry.

- •Consulted with structural engineer about belfry tilt. Consultation is ongoing. Some new thoughts have surfaced and are being evaluated, mainly concerning the reason for the settling of the main posts.

- The request to tear out one row of pews and expand the choir loft was withdrawn due to shrinkage of the choir.
- Thanks to Dave and Ginny Chase for the mowing and gardening!

Plans for next year:

- Top coat ramp
- Repair roof leak and ceiling. We've decided to wait on the belfry siding replacement until the tilt has been addressed.
- Replace more rotten wood.
- More painting.
- •Plan course of action on belfry tilt. One solution is to install two additional support posts. This is a major decision, structurally and aesthetically; we would need to remove half of the left rear pew because the posts need to go down to footings in the basement, and would come down near the front rail of the balcony. A second, less costly option is also being considered.
- Address belfry railing, time permitting. This is only cosmetic and a low priority.
- Valerie continues to clean the church on a voluntary basis.
- Work on the electronic chimes. We may need new speakers.
- New electrical service for parsonage.

Statement of Purpose of American Baptist Churches / U.S.A.

"American Baptist Churches in the U.S.A., as a manifestation of the church universal, bears witness to God's intention to bring redemption and wholeness to all creation. American Baptists believe that God's intention can be sought and followed in local congregations and other gatherings of Christians and in associational, regional, national and world bodies as they receive from one another mutual counsel and correction. Since Jesus Christ is the head of the church, each body of Christians, seeking to order its life in accordance with the Scriptures under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, has a proper responsibility under God for maintaining its life of worship, witness, and ministry.

In every area of their common life, American Baptists, acknowledging the importance of creative diversity, seek such a balance of freedom and order as will keep all parts of American Baptist Churches in the U.S.A. open to the guidance of the Holy Spirit and at the same time enable them to work responsibly to carry out the common task of mission and ministry in our time.

American Baptist Churches in the U.S.A. acknowledges that it shares a common faith in Christ with churches which may be quite different from it in history, polity and practice. Consequently, it seeks to share with them a common ministry and to express it faithfully.

American Baptist Churches in the U.S.A. acknowledges that God's will is also manifested in movements outside the formal structures of Christ's church, and that, therefore, it must respond faithfully to such disclosures.

American Baptist Churches in the U.S.A. further acknowledges and confirms its commitment to the objects stated in its Act of Incorporation as follows: 'to give expression to the opinions of its constituency upon moral, religious and denominational matters and to promote denominational unity and efficiency in efforts for the evangelization of the world'.

In the light of this affirmation, American Baptist Churches in the U.S.A. intends the following statement of

purpose to implement and not to alter the objects stated in its Act of Incorporation:

- --- to bear witness to the Gospel of Jesus Christ in the world and to lead persons to Christ;
- --- to seek the mind of Christ on moral, spiritual, political, economic, social, denominational and ecumenical matters, and to express to the rest of society on behalf of American Baptists, their convictions as to the mind of Christ in these matters:
- --- to guide, unify, and assist American Baptists in their witness in the world, in preparing members for the

work of ministry, and in serving both those within and outside the fellowship of Christ; and --- to promote closer relations among American Baptist churches and groups, within the whole Body of Christ and to promote understanding with other religious bodies."

Meeting opened at 11:57 am with a prayer by Pastor Hess.

(A booklet with all the reports was passed out for all to read.)

PASTORS REPORT: David made a special thanks to all our pastors in our church. He loved working with the choir and organist and how thankful we are to have all the new children in our fellowship and our shared vacation bible school.

MODERATORS' LETTER: This was read by Betty Heisig. She gave special thanks to all our new children in the church and a special note they are all from one family.

CLERKS REPORT: It was noted that there will be two upcoming baptisms coming soon. Report was read and a motion was made to accept report as written by Gretchen Young and second by Kathy Gosnell, motion passed.

TREASUERS REPORT: On page #1 summery page it stated that we started out with \$19,747.00 and ended in December with \$15,802.00. We are only \$4,000.00 less, we expected to be \$7,000.00 with all our expenses this is because of all the membership givings that we are doing better then expected. A motion was made to accept the report as written by Laurie Heisig and seconded by Mary Bailey, motion passed.

FINANCIAL REPORT: This was read and a motion to accept was made by Kathy Gosnell and second by Gretchen Young, all passed. Note: Lynne questioned page #8 office supplies - why was the cost so high. David explained it includes the maintenance agreement, ink paper etc.

POSPOSED BUDET: Comments by David that the General Offering was lower in our goal for 2012 because we are not making a special budged givings for the four main offerings we are just collecting from the membership on these four missions and sending in only that amount. Other changes are the pastoral salary & benefits lines please note there are reduction on retirement, medical insurance and flexible spending account. The changes give us a \$361.00 deduction.

Discussion/request:

The Deacons are asking for \$100 more because of their already expenses. We budgeted only \$275.00 and at this time they have already spent \$400.00. At this time there will not be an increase in the budget the Deacons usually make up their costs form the retreat and when ordering holiday flowers make sure that when giving out the costs that they are covered by the people ordering them.

The \$200.00 budgeted for Flower City should go to the South West Habitat for Humanity.

Valerie Fogarassy asked about the Upstate Children's Home could or would they accept donations of toys and clothes? David told her to call them and find this out. A motion to accept the minutes was made by Steve Wenthe and second by Betty Trim, motion passed.

MISSION COMMITTE REPORT: This report was read and we thanked the mission committee for their work. NOTE: It was asked why was the special offering made for the "One Great Hour of Sharing" so high in 2010? David explained that a special offering for the Haiti's Earth Quake Relief was added into it. Lynne Stewart asked that we do the mission "Leave something behind" this year in April and do it for all the five weeks. This was agreed by everyone so in April we will start bringing in, mainly paper products to give to this mission.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES REPORT: Report was read by all. Steve, boards chair reported that we as a church have a lot of serious repairs that need to be done in the following year. Example: The brick in the chimney is coming down and it isn't being used so we need to tear it down to the roof. The church belfry is leaning and needs new clapboards. There was a request by the choir that their area be enlarged. Steve will be working on a new arrangement to see if he can give them more room without taking out the first set of pews to enlarge the choir loft plus the cost to do so would be more then we can do with all the major repairs that need to be done to the church. There was a subjection that they more them up to the balcony which would also mean that we move the organ up there and we would have to check into the weight. David asked that we check into hanging the bell and Steve thinks we can do it ourselves instead of hiring someone to do it. A motion was made to accept the report as written by Joanne Wilbert and second by Lynne Steward, motion passed.

BOARD OF DEACONS REPORT: Name spelling corrections as follows: Jasmise Morse, Darnell Ashford, and no "e" on Covill. It was brought up, where does the money come from to pay for the coffee and tea for funerals etc? As of now it comes from the kitchen fund or from donations. Betty Heisig said if anyone needs supplies let her know ahead of time and she will go out and get them meaning coffee, tea, paper products, etc. There was a suggestion that we start using the dish washer to save on paper products so Steve Wenthe will be checking to make sure that it works. A motion to accept the report as written with spelling corrections was made by Gretchen Young and second by Della VanDoren, passed by all.

BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION REPORT: Gretchen Young read the report to the group. Response from all thanks very good job. This is the first year in years that the board has a full roster. Motion was made to accept the report as written by Don VanDoren and second by Mary Bailey, and passed by all.

NEW BUSINESS:

1.) Jo asked about the kitchen fund, should the kitchen fund be used for food supplies? It was only originally set up for maintenance or new equipment needed.

2.) On page #11 line #36 undesignated funds we have \$437.38 can it be renamed Hospitality Fund? So this money would be used for any food or drink needed for any funeral or the coffee hours etc. A motion was made that we rename "Undesignated Fund" to "Hospitality Fund" and use this money for any coffee etc needed for funerals and coffee hours by Lynne Stewart. This was accepted by all.

3.) Kathy Gosnell wanted to know what should happen to money that is given to the Deacons for doing funerals? If it is said by the family to go to the Deacons Fund it goes there otherwise it goes to the church after deducting the Deacons costs of the funeral.

- 4.) Cleaning the church: Val & Steve will take turns cleaning the inside of the church. Outside during the winter such as shoveling the walkways it was stated that we hired a snow removal person and they are suppose to shovel walkways but they are no always done cleanly since it can snow after they come so Val volunteered her son to come and shovel the walkways before church when it snows.
