A fun fundraiser for the Roger Cross House

St. Peter's Episcopal Church will host a concert to raise funds for the Roger Cross House at 4 p.m. Saturday, Nov. 7. Jazz guitarist and singer Miche Fambro will perform. A coalition of 12 churches has raised or pledged \$43,000 for the Flower City Habitat for Humanity project, but more than \$21,000 is needed by the end of the year. Roger Cross was the WHBC member instrumental in bringing Habitat to Rochester. Groundbreaking at 57 Ries Street is expected in late September with construction completed in December.

In 1910, Rev. Donald B. MacQueen appointed the church's first three-member mission committee. MacQueen was the protégée and immediate successor of Rev. John McFarlane, husband of Elizabeth McFarlane, organizer of the class that became known as the Elizabeth McFarlane Memorial Class. MacQueen himself was succeeded by Rev. Frederick Smith, who left to become a missionary in China.
