Not much has changed since this time last year with regards to love. The world is still in need of love, although it pretends daily that love is important. And maybe it is, but what kind of love? What have been the fruits of this love?

I think these are relevant questions for the church because we're great at talking about love, but our actions do not always reflect an understanding that God is not becoming more loving...God IS love! The very essence of Who God Is, is love! And, that love is Light and Life-giving. 1 John 1:5 says, "God is light and in Him is no darkness at all." That same love of God, is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us (Rom.5:5). Where is the Light of God's love in the church?

After having just seen the new Star Wars movie, my thoughts about love are playing off of the themes of light and dark, good and evil. Over the years, we have watched the battle between good and evil ebb and flow. We watched as Obi Wan, Yoda, Luke, Leia, Han and so many others battled against Darth Vader, the Emperor, Sith lords and the other purveyors of the death and destruction of the dark side of the Force. In the most recent installment, the story ends with a victory for good, and we see evil retreating to prepare for another day.

For us, it seems that hate is on a winning streak! Stevie Wonder sang, "Hate's going around breaking many hearts." Love is limping today. It's badly bruised and battered... overtaken by the dark side in us! Yoda said to Luke Skywalker, in the Empire Strikes Back, "Once you start down the dark path, forever will it dominate your destiny, consume you it will!

Our culture is certainly inundated with the shadow side of two forms of love: Eros, or sexual passion, and Philautia, or love of the self.

The expressions of sexuality that are admissible on television to-day would have been considered x-rated or pornographic less than 20 years ago. And, our senses have been dulled to the violent nature of many of these acts. I flip through the channels occasionally to see what's happening on this front, and just last week I watched a portion of a "comedy" that showed a male character doing something that amounted to assault on a female character. It got a big laugh!

Just yesterday, there was a remembrance service at SUNY Geneseo for the two victims of a

double murder, suicide. The killer was distraught after a recent breakup with the female victim. Was his, a reaction to love lost? Was he influenced by our nation's seeming acceptance of violence against women? Was the female victim tired of being "loved" in such a controlling or abusive way?

In this incident alone I see the shadow side of at least one of the two loves I mentioned, maybe both

When we think about self-love, we know that it is important to love ourselves. To be secure in who we are, and to like who we are. This self-understanding is supposed to *expand* our capacity to love others. But that is not what happened here. The young man who committed the murders could not have been grounded in a positive love of himself, to react in such a destructive, death-dealing way. When did he begin down such a dark path?

I mention this incident in particular, but this type of crime is not isolated to the Rochester area. Relationship violence is pandemic in this country. I think the statistic is that every nine seconds a woman is battered. Now, women



aren't the only ones being battered in relationships, but they do represent the majority of victims.

When our love motivates us to hate and evil, it is not love at all. When our "love" of individuals is motivated by a need for self-validation, a desire to control, or some prurient interest, we are heading for the shadow side, the dark path.

When our love of one group or ideology makes it permissible to mistreat others who don't look like us, believe like us, or have what we have,

we have started down the dark path. And yes, it is already consuming us!

I'll sign off now with another portion of 1 John, written to Christians that grappled with confessional integrity (that means living out, not just talking about what we say we believe!) and the potential for congregational self-destruction. We must choose to stay in the light!

"My beloved friends, let us continue to love each other since love comes from God. Everyone who loves is born of God and experiences a relationship with God. The person who refuses to love doesn't know the first thing about God, because God *is*

love—so you can't know him if you don't love. This is how God showed his love for us: God sent his only Son into the world so we might live through him. This is the kind of love we are talking about—not that we once upon a time loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as a sacrifice to clear away our sins and the damage they've done to our relationship with God. My dear, dear friends, if God loved us like this, we certainly ought to love each other.
