

SCOUT SUNDAY

February 3, 2019 is recognized as "Scout Sunday" throughout the United States. However, a particular religious organization may set aside any calendar date to celebrate the "scouts" within their organization. In fact WHBC will be celebrating "Scout Sunday" on February 10, 2019. Over 100 world countries celebrate their country's scouts.

Most U. S, scouting units celebrate the origin of Scouting by attending local places of religious worship each year. Whether it be "en masse" or as individuals; scouts, scouters (adult leaders), and parents acknowledge their Scout Oath phrase "Duty to God" and their Scout Law tenet "A scout is...Reverent!" by their worship attendance.

Please note that due to recent changes within the "Boy Scouts of America" organization, male "Boy Scouts", along with their female "Troop" scouts, are called "Scouts" and belong to "Scouts BSA" Troops. Cub Scouts now include both males and females as "Cub Scouts" in "Packs" and "Venturers" have always contained males and females within "Crews". It may be simpler to just refer to these young people as "scouts".

WHBC is pleased to recognize Scout BSA Troop 7, and Venture Crew 7, both sponsored by the Genesee Valley Fire Department in Henrietta. Troop 7 was organized approximately 68 years ago, while Crew 7 was organized approximately 15 years ago. Both scouting units will have uniformed scouts, leaders and parents attending our Sunday morning worship. The Scurlock family are longtime members of WHBC, and invited the "Scouts" to worship with us.

Ryan Scurlock is an Eagle Scout from Troop 7, and continues to serve as an adult leader, as time permits. Dan has served the Boy Scouts of America as a longtime active leader of Troop 7 and Crew 7, while also serving scouting locally in numerous leader and adult trainer roles. Sharon previously served scouts as a Cub Scout Den Leader and continues to actively support her two "boys" in their scouting activities.

As a matter of record, Karl and Paul Hirschman are also Eagle Scouts from Troop 7. In fact, Karl's son Ryan has also received his Eagle Scout Award. For those not aware, "Eagle Scout" is the highest award a young person may earn as a "Scout BSA". "Pathfinder" is the highest award a young person may earn as a "Venture" scout. 
