Rev. Dr. Peter Grinion

Born in Thompson Hill, Hanover, Jamaica, to the late Cyril Grinion and Sidna Grinion, Rev. Dr. Peter Grinion has spent many years studying and preparing for the ministry he now undertakes. His academic resume includes simultaneous undergraduate studies from 1980 to 1984 at the United Theological College of the West Indies and the University of the West Indies. He holds two master's degrees from the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, Ky. He earned a Master of Divinity degree there in 1992 and a Master of Social Work degree in 1996. He also holds two doctorates, a Doctor of Education degree completed in 1999 at Spalding University in Louisville and a Doctor of Philosophy degree from the University of KWA-Zulu, Natal, Durban, South Africa. He received his Licensed Clinical Social Work (LCSW) Board Certificate from the State University of New York State in 2006.

Following completion of his intensive undergraduate studies in 1984, young Grinion was ordained to the Christian ministry by the Ebenezer Circuit of Baptist Churches, St. Andrew, Jamaica. He served there as Senior Pastor until 1988. He then served as Senior Pastor of Jericho Circuit of Baptist Churches until 1991. During those years, Rev. Grinion served bi-vocationally as a Probation and Parole officer with the Jamaica Correctional Services.



Today's Speaker

This year marks the Rev. Dr. Vera Miller's 20th year as pastor of Genesee Baptist Church. The church has tripled its attendance under her leadership. Her accomplishments include initiating a

Summer Arts Program for neighborhood youth and fundraising for building and grounds improvements. She has served on the Ordination Review Committee of the American Baptist Churches of the Rochester/Genesee Region for more than a decade and was recognized for outstanding service. She also earned the Sojourner Truth Award, the highest



As a vocalist, Dr. Miller has performed at Carnegie Hall in New York City and at the Eastman Theater. She toured western New York as a soloist with Chuck Mangione and continues to sing in her church choir.

A native of Atlanta, Ga., Dr. Miller holds graduate degrees from SUNY Brockport and Colgate Rochester Crozer Divinity School where she received a Doctor of Ministry in Transformative Leadership.

She has three adult children, Rogena, Rodney, and Veronica Miller, and three grandchildren, Donovan Lee, Michelle Leola, and Sidney Marie.

An Historical Perspective

The Rev. Dr. Peter E. Grinion is installed today as the 48th pastor of the 201-year-old West Henrietta

Baptist. Although WHBC's first permanent black pastor, Dr. Grinion, as a native of Jamaica, follows another tradition long known here: immigrant pastor. Preachers from England, Scotland, and Canada have filled the pulpit of Henrietta's oldest church building, sharing the Word with the lilts, brogues, and accents of their homelands.



Dr. Grinion also follows in the footsteps of the congregation's first ordained pastor, the Rev. Thomas Gorton, who preached, beginning in 1815, in the first barns and homes along the Genesee River. Not until 1818 was a log cabin church built. This first pastor pioneered with his neighbors, shared their New England roots -- and eventually their grandchildren and great grandchildren. Rev. Gorton was a fifth-generation descendant of Samuel Gorton, an Englishman persecuted and banished by the Massachusetts Bay Colony, who spent the rest of his life championing the Rhode Island charters that gave that tiny colony -- and by example ultimately a new nation -- both religious freedom and the separation of church and state.

WHBC is grateful to God today for a pastor equipped to lead us into our third century with the same bold Christian spirit that built our past.
