Striving To Be The Community's Church

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

During this time of the year, we have a large number of new residents in the communities of Henrietta. They are here as new employees, new college students, returning students, and new home owners, and soon they will be shopping for a church home. I am presently working with the Board of deacons to use bulk mail to connect with some of these people. Aside from being a fairly easy way to send out information, we can use bulk mail to send out information about our church, invite people to attend Sunday morning services and Wednesday morning Bible study, and as a means of staying connected with our respective communities.

Because there are so many churches in Henrietta, people have lots of choice and will visit churches until they find one which is deemed good for their family. We have to do a better job with our visitors, reaching out with open arms in ways that capture their admiration. The way we welcome visitors says much more about us in either negative or positive ways than we may imagine. It may seem like I am overstating this concern, but we need a Welcoming Committee.

According to Darby Jones (2015), welcoming visitors means initiating relationships with people who potentially will become members of our faith family. Our welcoming ministry should aim to encourage visitors to return. All members should endeavor to know what to do to encourage our visitors to become a part of our church. In short, just as it is advantageous to know about our church's reason it exists, our priorities, and responsibilities, we need to know something about the types of visitors we welcome week after week. Who are they and what they seek are questions we should strive to get answers from. Jones argues that the ability to identify different types of visitors can help us to understand what each one seeks. The following is a list of the types of visitors we welcome to our church:

- **Dissatisfied** visitors are looking for a "better church." Either your church has what they are looking for or it doesn't. Their decision about returning will be based on these criteria.
- **Invited** visitors come at the request of someone they know. They may not be looking for a church, but they may find a reason to return and stay.
- Seekers want something spiritual. They look for real people with genuine smiles. They want authentic answers to their questions.
- **Skippers** jump from church to church. Some like to meet people or network. Others are transient, moving on when something doesn't suit them. Sometimes their job calls for continual travel.
- **Deep-rooted** visitors are active in their church and looking for a place to settle in for the long haul. When they move into a community, they are usually ready to serve.

Surely, knowledge of what different visitors seek can guide us as we get to know them and help them understand whether our congregation is a good spiritual fit. The truth is that we want visitors to settle in with us. I pray that we all will become intentional about reaching new people and connecting them to the life of our church and to a personal relationship with Jesus.



gotsneakers? A Sneaker Recycling Organization

We are launching an ongoing Fundraiser similar to recycling bottles with GotSneakers. We will send what we have each month (for free) to them. The uncoming Garage

month (for free) to them. The upcoming Garage Sale is a perfect time to donate. So collect what you won't wear again and donate them.

Their mission is to partner with the sneaker community to recycle and reuse quality pre-loved sneakers. All reusable sneakers are recirculated to secondhand markets so people can access quality, pre-owned footwear at affordable prices. All heavily used and damaged footwear is recycled to reuse materials or to convert waste into new energy.

GotSneakers will not accept any nonathletic footwear including but not limited to dress shoes, heels, rain boots, sandals, slip-ons, water socks, wedges, and work boots of any kind. Please tie or bundle both sneakers of a pair together. It effects the amount we will be paid for each qualifying pair as follows:

Excellent: \$7.00 per pair, Good \$2.00/pair, Fair \$1.00/pair Recyclable \$.25 cents/pair, Non-Paired (Singles): \$0.00 We will place a collection box on the Erie Station porch for donations from the community.

In the U.S. at least 200 million pairs of shoes and sneakers end up in landfills each year. Shoes in landfills can take 30 to 40 years to decompose. Harmful chemicals are emitted into the soil and air which pollutes our surroundings. The environmental benefits of recycling and reusing sneakers are significant. Since we started out on our mission, GotSneakers has stopped 75 million pounds of CO2 from entering the atmosphere. We've also recycled and reused 2.5 million pairs of shoes and we're not stopping there. Any proceeds will go toward the Capital Fund.




AYDEN MADE HIS
